Born on April 14, 1891, Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar is also known as the ‘Father of the Indian Constitution’ as he headed the committee which drafted the Constitution of India. A jurist and also an economist, he was posthumously conferred the Bharat Ratna, the country's highest civilian award in 1990, more than 30 years after his demise on December 6, 1956. Ambedkar Jayanti is being observed as a public holiday through the country since 2015.

The Regional Institute of Education, Bhubaneswar organized a programme in the memory of 131<sup>st</sup> Birth Anniversary of B.R. Ambedkar on 14.04.2022 at 4.30 PM in the New Auditorium of this Institute.



Prior the college published the official notification of the programme, All the student teacher were requested to participate and attend the programme. The auditorium has been set up in a grander arrangement and by 4.30 PM the programme started with an inauguration by the honourable Principal Prof. P. C. Agarwal, Prof. Laxmidhar Behera Sir, Mr. Puskar Behera an invitation of Dr. Kalinga Ketaki Sir to embrace the programme. After that an Aarti Song was presented by B.A. B.Ed. 1<sup>st</sup> Year girls and all the dignitaries assembled for lightning of lamp.

Programme Coordinator, Dr. Kalinga Ketaki speaks about B. R. Ambedkar as a lawyer, political people, economist, social worker. B. R. Ambedkar was completion of Ph.D from Cambridge University, states the important of education, liberty and justice to all and also educated at Elphinstone College, Mumbai, Columbia University, USA, and London School of Economics, UK. He was the first Indian to pursue a doctorate in economics abroad. He served as the Principal of the Government Law College, Mumbai for 2 years. He headed the committee that drafted the Indian Constitution, which was adopted on January 26, 1950. By profession, he was a jurist and economist, and also served as Law and Justice minister in the first cabinet and Jawaharlal Nehru. Ambedkar was 1<sup>st</sup> law man of Independent India as main architect father of Indian Constitution, a great social reformer worker in justice and empowerment of dalits. Wrote book Allegation of Past on 15<sup>th</sup> May 1936. He was source of inspiration for student and activist. Dalit leaders, especially Ambedkar, believed the pact would allow Dalits to advance their interests. The part marked the start of the movement against “untouchability” within the Indian nationalist movement.



Then Dr. Kalinga Ketaki invites speaker Abhijit Kumar, B.Ed., 1<sup>st</sup> year student, he describe in brief history of Ambedkar and said about Ambedkar published his book Annihilation of Caste on 15<sup>th</sup> May 1936. It strongly criticized Hindu orthodox religious leaders and the caste system in general. Then invite Avinash Kumar, B.A. B.Ed. 2<sup>nd</sup> year student, he tells a story about B. R. Ambedkar struggle as a Dalit on his early school. Next Udit Kumar came who highlight the issues of casteism and reservation in accordance. Then Deepika Roy, B.Sc. B.Ed. 1<sup>st</sup> year speaks about Ambedkar's dream toward building of new India. Thereafter, Kishore Kumar talk about people and other lawyer makes taunt on him. His dedication toward providing of justice to poor and helpless. Lastly Manish Kumar, B.Ed. 1<sup>st</sup> year, he points out his suffering to be born in a dalit family, Ambedkar light against oppression. Ambedkar's legacy as a socio-political reformer had a deep effect on modern India. He passionately believed in individual freedom and criticized caste-based society.



Then Dr. Ketaki Sir invites hon'ble dignitaries at first Prof. Laxmidhar Behera Sir. He stressed the impact of Social Justice in Pedagogy, Universalisation of Education. Then Prithish Acharya Sir came stresses on the issues of untouchability, urge student leader to present something new and before question, we have to introspect our self first. Next Prof. S. K. Das came to give some advice on how to transform a speech. Struggle and knowledge makes a man powerful and perfect.



Then Programme Coordinator on behalf o all students wishes Odia New Year and then thank him for acting as a Chief Authority which makes the cultural programme successful.

After that, Hon'ble Principal Sir started his speech; he talks about the equality in all as we all are creation of almighty. Encourage students for active participation in all programmes. He analyse about why Ambedkar adopted Budhism and his expertise in all field of education, inclusiveness and unity.



Then Ketaki Sir invited Pushkar Behera Sir, for Vote of thanks. Finally the programme summed up with the mass singing of National anthem and distribution of refreshment to all students and faculty/staff members.

Prof. B.P. Bharadwaj, Head DER, NCERT, New Delhi, delivered a talk on Integration of 21<sup>st</sup> century Skills in Teacher Education. His speech begins with addressing the students, and the dignitaries. He emphasized on NEP 2020, and role of a teacher. He added that a teacher should be very much aware of the content; he must have good communication skills, the way he

explains the content plays a very important role in the teaching learning process. Prof. B.P. Bharadwaj further added that a teacher should be experimental with the methods of teaching and evaluation. He also showed light on the key features of ancient education of India, that how it gave importance to ethics and values and much importance was given to the way of living. He also explained the type of classroom a school must have, it should have highly qualified teachers and technically advanced classroom. Lastly he shared his experience as a teacher before the technology could add to this teaching learning process.



Prof. G. Biswanath, Head, DEE, RIE Mysore, delivered his talk on ICT and Teacher Education, he shared his own experience as a teacher, that how he witnessed the transition of Education from a simple analogue calculator to smart computers. He stated that with the help of this user friendly technology how education can be delivered with efficiency through charts, posters, 3D models, presentation and how the technology as a tool facilitated the teaching and learning process in pandemic through radio, television and mobile.



Prof. N. Pradhan, Professor of Education, NERIE, Shilong, delivered his talk on "Vision and scenario of teacher Education in India". His speech started with the phrase that, there is a huge gap in the reality we have now and the vision we have for Education. He shared the four milestones of Teacher Education i.e. 1. Establishment of NCT 1992, 2<sup>nd</sup> Supreme court judgement 2012, 3<sup>rd</sup> Justice Verma Committee 2012 report, 4<sup>th</sup> NEP 2020. He further added Information about Stand Alone Teacher Education Institutions. He suggested that Teacher

Education Institutions should have their own accreditation body. Then he putted light on the current scenario of Teacher Education. He said that teachers must be grounded with Indian Ethics & Indian values. He mentioned about stand alone Teacher Education Institutes, he said these must become multidisciplinary. He also shared about the recommendations that Common Entrance Exam to be replaced by National Testing Agency. While sharing about the scenario of Teacher Education programme he added that there is a 8 times growth in the Teacher Education Institutions from 1971-2001 and the number of courses increased 10 times. At the end of his talk he recommended that there should be co-ordinated development of teacher education and Indian values must be added in the programme, and there should be professional development of the teachers.



Prof. M. A. Khader, Retd. Principal, RIE, Bhubaneswar, delivered his talk on development of teacher Education. He stated that, the topic of Development of Teacher Education is a vast topic, teachers are not only the one who transfers the education but he is much more than that, infact he's a very important aspect of education system. He stated that there is a huge difference between a teacher, preacher and political leader and further explained the role of a teacher. He added that technology can only empower teachers it cannot replace the teachers. A teacher teaches the society irrespective of the social division with equality. A teacher must be self-evaluating, self-involving and have acceptance to the changes happening over time. A teacher also should have a philosophical approach. He also explained two theories of philosophy, constructivism and Existentialism where Essence precedes existence and Existence precedes essence. He further added that a teacher is not what he teaches; a teacher is that what he does. At the end of his talk he shared his opinions and observations that, there should be only one degree for Teacher Education Like other professional courses B.Tech and M.Tech. or MBBS. and he again emphasized in critical thinking, critical pedagogy questioning the knowledge and said that he believes in existentialism, where every individual is a free person and responsible for his own development through the acts of will.

Prof. Sandhya Rani Sahoo, Dean of Instructions, RIE, Bhubaneswar, summarised the talk of all the dignitaries and expressed her gratitude to the dignitaries for enriching and inspiring the students and also the teachers through the sharing information and their experiences. Before ending the programme Dr. Kalinga Ketaki, The Programme Coordinator gave vote of thanks to all the Dignitaries, to the Principal, Dean of Instruction, Head of Extension Education, to the faculty members, non-teaching staff, ICT studio, C & W department, Establishment Section, Security Supervisor and to students for their unconditional support in Successful completion



In-charge principal, Prof. S. K. He explained that before partition Purna Swaraj Diwas used to be celebrated by Indian Congress as the day of Independence on November 26, to keep the importance of the date alive although constitution was ready before the date, still the constitution day is celebrated on this particular Day. He gave the example of Present President Smt. Draupadi Murmu that itself explains the power of Indian Constitution that any one from the county can become the head of the country if h/she has the ability to hold the position and administer the powers and responsibilities. It is a tribute to Dr. B. R. Ambedkar the founding Father of Indian Constitution. He shared the history of making of the constitution.



The constitution was drafted by the Constituent Assembly, which was elected by elected members of the provincial assemblies. The 389-member assembly (reduced to 299 after the partition of India) took almost three years to draft the constitution holding eleven sessions over a 165-day period. The Constitution formed the Republic of India on January 26, 1950, and the Constituent Assembly ceased to exist on that date. It took a long Duration of 2 years 11 months and 18 Days to make Constitution of India. It is the largest constitution of the World. He said that its not just a legal document but also a social legacy which aims to bring positive changes in society. He thanked present Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi for identifying this day as National Constitution Day. He further added that constitution should not only be followed in the public and private organized sectors but also should be a way of life for Every Indian. The fundamental duties, fundamental rights should be known to every citizen of India. Some of the countries like Pakistan, China, Sri Lanka has their constitution but they really do not practice it but India is a full-fledged Republic Country. The Indian government is accountable to its citizen for its each and every action taken and its consequences. He advised the students to watch news channel which are authentic and not to listen to some of news channel which only spread some confined propaganda. The observation of constitutional day should not only be symbolic but also be substantial. He concluded his talk by the lines that to make India a genuine democracy, the makes of constitution decided to make Indian Govt. a parliamentary form of govt. instead of having a presidential form of Govt.



The Program Coordinator, Dr. Kalinga Ketaki gave his speech for formal Vote of Thanks. Prof. P. C. Agrawal addressed the gathering. Informed the gathering about the importance of the day. In his speech he gave credit to the govt of India for recognizing the birth anniversary of Subhash Chandra Bose as Parakram Diwas. Putting light on the heroic life events of Subhash Chandra Bose he further added some of the bold steps taken by Bose to show disobedience against British Govt. like resigning from the most prestigious Institution of India i.e. Indian Civil Services in the year of 192, also the active participation of Bose in movements like Non-Cooperation and Simon-go-back Andolan with Mahatma Gandhi.





Prof. P. C. Agrawal also emphasized the ideology of Subhas Chandra Bose, he was also the president of Indian National Congress but resigned from the position to avoid conflict within the group, which shows his emotional strength and love for the country. Bose also formed Azad Hind Fauz, even with less resources he could manage to operate first military force of India. He went to the jail of Andaman and Nicobar and also was the first person from India to take help from the UNO for the freedom of India. All these acts of Bose acted as milestone of getting India freedom. His contribution should not be minimized. And many times, there is a need for applying the methods of Netaji to protect India from the evil intention of the neighboring countries. Prof. P. C. Agrawal concluded his speech by saying that today India is leading the globe in many fields, and we also need more Economic, Political and Spiritual Strength for a even brighter future of India. The country needs many Gandhi, Nehru and Netaji to achieve this goal. And a teacher has a very strong role in shaping the future citizens of India and consequently shape the future of India. And we should think towards maintaining the sovereignty of the country for endless times.



After the speech of the Principal, Student volunteer speaker Hrudaya Mohini Mohanta, B.A. first year gave her speech about the biography of Subhash Chandra Bose, and his demand for Purna Swaraj, and underlined the fact that Bose was the one who gave the title of Father of Nation to Mahatma Gandhi.



Dean of Instructions, Prof. Sandhya Rani Sahoo, gave her speech by appreciating the speech of student volunteers, she expressed that she could feel the spark of Subhash Bose in the students. She defined the term what Parakram means Power that can bring change. She emphasized that Netaji was considered as Yogi for his continuous Sadhana to fight for the freedom of India. She added that Bose is the pride of India, Odisha. An activist and revolutionary leader in India and abroad. She underlined the fact that the fiery speeches of Bose inspired a wave of freedom fight against Britishers in the people of India and other contribution of Bose like giving emphasize in vocational training, equality and freedom of speech, liberty, justice and advocates the rights of the oppressed and discriminated, formation of Azad Hind Fauz, Women Regiment Rani Laxmi Bai Regiment.
