

Minutes of the State Coordination Committee (SCC) Meeting, Odisha held at RIE, Bhubaneswar on 4.2.2020

The State Coordination Committee (SCC) meeting of RIE, NCERT, Bhubaneswar for the State of Odisha was held on 4th February 2020 at 12.30 pm in the institute to discuss about the state needs and plan programme for 2020-21 on school education and teacher education. **Smt. Chithra Arumugam, IAS, Principal Secretary, School and Mass Education Department, Govt. of Odisha** chaired the meeting.

A list of participant members and special invitees are annexed.

At the outset, Prof. P.C. Agarwal, Principal, RIE, Bhubaneswar and the convener welcomed the Chairperson and all the members of the SCC and requested permission of the chairperson to proceed further in the matter. He outlined the role of NCERT and RIE, Bhubaneswar and informed that SCC in each state provides a forum to coordinate the identification of the state's educational needs related to school education and teacher education. The SCC recommends to the NCERT academic inputs required to develop the state's educational competence at key level. He briefly presented the status of innovative ongoing project "Implementation of NCERT Interventions at School Stage: A Block Level Research Project".

With the permission of Chair, Prof. S.K. Dash, Head, Department of Extension Education (DEE), RIE, Bhubaneswar presented the major outcomes of PAC programme for the state of Odisha for the session 2017-18 and 2018-19. Prof S.K. Dash also presented the status of the PAC programme for the year 2019-20. He informed that during 2017-18 the institute has completed five programmes for Odisha on different areas. The programmes completed during 2017-2018 are (1) A Study of Pedagogic Processes in Science at Government Secondary Schools of Odisha (2) Case Study of Educational Institutions run by Buddhists in Odisha (3) Low Performance of Students in Odia and Social Science in High School Certificate (HSC) Examination in Odisha: An Analysis (4) A Study on secondary school mathematics classrooms of Bhubaneswar (5) Training Programme for capacity building of district level gender coordinators in Odisha (6) Orientation of Key Resource Persons at Elementary and Secondary Level on ICT. During the session 2018-19 the programmes completed are:

- i) Education for Sustainable Development: Study and Documentation of indigenous knowledge and innovative practices on conservation of Natural Resource from Tribal pockets of Odisha
- ii) Enhancement of Skills for Conservation and Propagation of Medicinal Plants for Pre-service Education Programme
- iii) Capacity Building Programme on Learning Outcomes for Elementary Teachers of Madrasas (Odisha)
- iv) Orientation Programme for KRPs from Odisha for Developing Quality Questions for Secondary Level.

- v) Capacity Building of Teachers at Secondary Level on Guidance and Counselling for Bihar and Odisha
- vi) Implementation of NCERT Intervention at School Stage: A Block Level Research Project.

Prof.S.K.Dash also presented the status of the following PAC programme held for 2019-20 up to 31st March 2020.

- i) Implementation of NCERT Interventions at School Stage: A Block Level Research Project.
- ii) Development of Handbook on Field Engagement in Pre- service Teacher Education in Odisha
- iii) Capacity Building Programme for KRPs of OAVs (Secondary in Science)
- iv) Capacity Building Programme on Inclusive Education for Secondary level Maulvis of Madrasas at Odisha.

The followings are the highlights of the key observations and recommendations of the SCC meeting.

1. The Chairperson thanked the NCERT and the Institute for conducting programmes in different areas of school education and teacher education in the state.
2. The chairperson observed that that state has been doing different programmes for quality improvement of school education and academic support of the RIE, Bhubaneswar will be useful for this.NCERT may support in translation of e contents/resources in Odia language.
3. After discussion, the following need based programmes are proposed for 2020-21.
 - i) Development of Materials for Teachers Teaching Early Primary Grades (I-II) on Spoken English
 - ii) Development of Question Bank at Secondary Level for Promotion of Process Based Skills
 - iii) Capacity Building Programme for Teachers Teaching in English at Senior Secondary Level of Odisha

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks by Dr. Laxmidhar Behera, Professor and State Coordinator (Odisha) for RIE, Bhubaneswar to Chair and other members of SCC.

Minutes of the State Coordination Committee (SCC) Meeting, Odisha held at RIE, Bhubaneswar on 14.12.2018

The State Coordination Committee (SCC) meeting of RIE, NCERT, Bhubaneswar for the State of Odisha was held on 14th December 2018 at 12.30 pm in the institute to discuss about the state needs and plan programme for 2019-20 on school education and teacher education. Shri Pradipta Kumar Mohapatra, IAS, Principal Secretary to Government, School and Mass Education Department, Government of Odisha chaired the meeting.

A list of participant members and special invitees is annexed.

At the outset Prof. P.C. Agarwal, Principal, RIE, Bhubaneswar and the convener welcomed the Chairperson and all the members of the SCC and requested permission of the chairperson to proceed further in the matter. He outlined the role of NCERT and RIE, Bhubaneswar and informed that SCC in each state provides a forum to coordinate the identification of the state's educational needs related to school education and teacher education. The SCC recommends to the NCERT academic inputs required to develop the state's educational competence at key level.

Professor Saroj Yadav, Dean (Academic), NCERT, New Delhi and member apprised the committee about the functions and coordination among RIEs, Departments of NIE, CIET & PSSCIVE for extending academic support to states & UTs.

With the permission of Chair, Prof. S.K. Dash, Head, Department of Extension Education (DEE), RIE, Bhubaneswar presented the major outcomes of PAC programme for the state of Odisha for the session 2016-17 and 2017-18. Prof S.K. Dash also presented the status of the PAC programmes for the year 2018-19. He informed that during 2016-17 the institute has completed four programmes for Odisha on different areas. The programmes completed during 2016-17 were: (i) A Study of Pedagogic Practices in D.El.Ed. Programme of DIETs of Odisha, (ii) A Study of Functioning of Madrasas at Primary Level, (iii) Gender Sensitivities and Responsiveness of Secondary Schools in Odisha: An Analysis, (iv) Functioning of Libraries of Government Schools in Odisha.

The outcomes of the following programmes conducted during the session 2017-2018 were presented:

- i) A Study of Pedagogic Processes in Science at Government Secondary Schools of Odisha
 - ii) Case Study of Educational Institutions run by Buddhists in Odisha
 - iii) Low Performance of Students in Odia and Social Science in High School Certificate (HSC) Examination in Odisha: An Analysis
 - iv) A Study on mathematics classrooms of Bhubaneswar
 - v) Training Programme for capacity building of district level gender coordinators in Odisha
 - vi) Orientation of Key Resource Persons at Elementary and Secondary Level on ICT
- The reports of all the above programmes were handed over to the Chairman of SCC.

Prof. S.K. Dash also presented the status of the following PAC programme held for 2018-19 up to November 2018.

- Education for Sustainable Development: Study and Documentation of indigenous knowledge and innovative practices on conservation of Natural Resource from Tribal pockets of Odisha
- Enhancement of Skills for Conservation and Propagation of Medicinal Plants for Pre-service Education Programme
- Capacity Building Programme on Learning Outcomes for Elementary Teachers of Madrasas (Odisha)
- Orientation Programme for KRPs from Odisha for Developing Quality Questions for Secondary Level.
- Capacity Building of Teachers at Secondary Level on Guidance and Counselling for Bihar and Odisha
- Implementation of NCERT Intervention at School Stage: A Block Level Research Project.

The followings are the key observations and recommendations of the SCC meeting.

1. The Chairperson thanked the Institute for conducting programmes in different areas of school

education and teacher education in the state. He discussed about the last SCC Minutes and it was confirmed.

2. The Director TE & SCERT, Odisha suggested need based programmes on Capacity Building of KRPs on Action Research, Development of strategies for culture specific (culturally responsive) internship models for pre-service teacher education institutes of the state, Planning for learning enhancement, Orientation of Principals and Teacher Educators of Aspirational districts, Orientation of master teacher educators on teaching and learning language and sharing workshop of eastern zone best practices of teacher education.
3. Shri Bhupendra Singh Poonia, SPD, OPEPA and OMSM thanked RIE, Bhubaneswar and NCERT for conducting different need based programmes for the state. He suggested that the outcomes of research and training programmes need to be shared among concerned state officials for better follow up. Some of the areas where OPEPA and RMSA of the state need NCERT's academic support are Technology and e-content development (for classes I-X), Research/Assessment of classroom practices and innovation and content cum pedagogic enrichment of Teachers of Odisha Adarsh Vidyalaya Sangathan (OAVS).
4. Prof. Saroj Yadav, Dean, Academic, NCERT suggested that the training programme proposed must focus on orientation of Master trainers/KRPs. The state may create a resource group for secondary education and NCERT will provide expertise in training of KRPs. However the state must have follow up actions for training teachers subsequently.
5. The Chairperson observed that that state has been conducting innovative programmes for remedial programmes like *Ujjawal*, *Vilhan* and *Utkarsha* at primary, upper primary and secondary level respectively. The programme has larger impact as observed from field visit by state officials. The performance of the state in NAS is not satisfactory in the country. NCERT may provide academic support for enhancing learning outcomes of the state. The outcomes of the block level interventions will be implemented throughout the state by the state School and Mass Education Department.
6. The President, BSE, Odisha, Dr. Jahan Ara Begum thanked RIE, Bhubaneswar for conducting a need based training programme for paper setters of the state. She suggested that the research outcome needs to be shared for larger implications.
7. After discussion, the following need based programmes are proposed for 2019-20:
 - (a) Capacity Building Programme for Key Resource Persons on Action Research.
 - (b) Development of Strategies for Culture Specific Internship Programme.
 - (c) Orientation of KRPs on Learning Outcomes and NAS Outcomes.
(The programme may be with Chilika Block Study)
 - (d) Orientation of DIET Principals and Teacher Educators on Attainment of Indicators of Aspirational Districts.
 - (e) Orientation of KRPs (Teacher Educators) of DIETs on Language Pedagogy for effective learning of language. (The programme will be referred to Department of Languages, NIE, NCERT, New Delhi)
 - (f) Providing support by CIET, NCERT, New Delhi to the state on e-Content Development (Classes I-X). (The programme will be referred to CIET, NCERT, New Delhi)
 - (g) Content and Pedagogy Enrichment Programme for KRPs of OAVS (Secondary) in Science
 - (h) Sharing of Best Practices in Teacher Education of Eastern Region.

- RIE Bhubaneswar may conduct pre-training and post-training assessment of the students and teachers.
- To that end experts & trainers from RIE may visit the schools of the UT and observe the classroom teaching so as to determine whether the classroom teaching is being conducted as per the training imparted by RIE Bhubaneswar.
- RIE Bhubaneswar may develop appropriate tools/test module to assess the creativity skills of the students of class IX and X to promote innovative attitude. To achieve this RIE Bhubaneswar may also commission a pilot study on the topic "Effect of Socio-Economic conditions on creativity skills" considering the Socio-Economic status of Islanders.
- The UT Administration is in the process of setting up of smart Classrooms in all the schools of these Islands in Phased manner. However the tender for the same has not been successful. In this regard RIE Bhubaneswar has informed that the institution has developed NCERT syllabus based digital contents. Hence, it is requested that RIE Bhubaneswar may provide the digital contents in various subjects in soft format/hard discs.
- RIE Bhubaneswar has also been requested to provide regular Refresher Courses/

training in the subjects- Mathematics, English, EVS, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Economics, History, Hindi, Geography, Political Science, and Computer Science etc. for the teachers of this U.T.

- Experts and trainees from RIE Bhubaneswar may visit, inspect and observe the classroom teaching of this UT on regular basis i.e. bi-monthly basis to identify the learning gaps and to suggest/impart remedial measures.

The faculties from RIE-Bhubaneswar have agreed in principle to the discussions and assured that appropriate actions will be initiated from the concerned institution.

Minutes of the State Coordination Committee (SCC) Meeting of Odisha held at Regional Institute of Education, Bhubaneswar on 13.2.2021

The State Coordination Committee (SCC) meeting of RIE, NCERT, Bhubaneswar for the State of Odisha was held on 13th February 2021 at 11am in the institute to discuss about the state needs and plan programme for 2021-2022 on school education and teacher education. Sri Satyabrata Sahu, IAS, Principal Secretary, School and Mass Education Department, Govt. of Odisha chaired the meeting.

A list of participant members and special invitees are annexed.

At the outset, Prof. P.C. Agarwal, Principal, RIE, Bhubaneswar and the convener welcomed the Chairperson and all the members of the SCC and requested permission of the chairperson to proceed further in the matter. He outlined the role of NCERT and RIE, Bhubaneswar and informed that SCC in each state provides a forum to coordinate the identification of the state's educational needs related to school education and teacher education. The SCC recommends to the NCERT academic inputs required to develop the state's educational competence at key level. He briefly presented the status of innovative ongoing project "Implementation of NCERT Interventions at School Stage: A Block Level Research Project". He also shared about the academic support provided to the state for NISHTHA and other programmes.

With the permission of Chair, Prof. M.K. Satapathy, Head, Department of Extension Education (DEE), RIE, Bhubaneswar presented the major outcomes of PAC programme for the state of Odisha for the session 2019-20 and the status of the PAC programme for the year 2020-21. The following programmes were conducted during 2019-20 session.

- i) Implementation of NCERT Interventions at School Stage: A Block Level Research Project.
- ii) Development of Handbook on Field Engagement in Pre- Service Teacher Education in Odisha
- iii) Capacity Building Programme for KRPs of OAVs (Secondary in Science)







Outlining the purpose of the SCC meeting, Prof. Sahoo requested the Committee to suggest programmes in the area of school education and teacher education to be taken up by RIE, Bhubaneswar after approval of the PAC of NCERT.

Prof. L. Behera, Head, DEE with the permission of the Chair, introduced the members present in the meeting. Prof. Behera specified about the programmes conducted by the Institute during last two sessions 2019-2020 and 2020-2021. He briefed about the progress of the following programmes undertaken during current session by the Institute for the State of Odisha: (1) Spatial mapping of Green Skills (2) Analysis of the 21st Century Employability Skills of the students at Secondary level (3) Implementation of NCERT Interventions at School Stage. The Institute has undertaken an intervention project in Chilka Block of Odisha and the research work is on progress (4) Conceptual activities on Science at Elementary level of Odisha using locally available toys (5) Development of communication skills in English of the Primary School Teachers of Odisha.

Shri Sanat Kumar Mohanty, Director, TE & SCERT suggested programmes like: DIET-CRC Linkage, Capacity Building of DIET Teacher Educators on conduction of Educational Research, Capacity Building of KRPs on E-content Development, Development of Resource Materials on Implementation of Bag-less Days and Academic Support to DIETs for Quality Improvement and Excellence.

Shri Anupam Saha, IAS, State Project Director, OSEPA suggested a programme for transformation of Vocational Education in High Schools of the state.

Mr. Ramashis Hazra, President, Board of Secondary Education, Odisha suggested a programme i.e. Development of Handbook and Guidelines on Planning and Implementation of Vocational Education.

Mrs. Prativa Manjari Das, Deputy Director, OAVS, Govt. of Odisha suggested the need for capacity building of teachers and School Heads and development of resource materials on assessment strategies.

Mrs. P.B.S. Usha, Director, KVS, ZIET stressed the need of art integrated learning at foundational stage as envisaged in the NEP 2020.

Prof. B.N. Panda, Dean of Research mentioned that the programmes proposed would be undertaken by the institute considering the resource availability and after due approval from the PAC, NCERT.


Mr. Bishupada Sethi, Principal Secretary to Government, Department of School and Mass Education Govt. of Odisha and Chairperson of the SCC appreciated the endeavour of RIE, Bhubaneswar and NCERT. He suggested to conduct SCC meeting more frequently for follow up and meaningful implementation. After discussion, the following programmes were listed as emerging programmes for the session 2022-23.

1. Academic Support for DIET-CRC Linkage
2. Capacity Building of DIET Teacher Educators on conduction of Educational Research
3. Capacity Building of KRPs on E-content Development
4. Academic Support to DIETs for Quality Improvement and Excellence
5. Development of Resource Materials on Implementation of Bag-less Days
6. Development of resource materials on Vocational Education and implementation of Bag-less Days.
7. Identification of learning gaps, innovations and challenges during the Covid-19 pandemic.
8. Development of resources materials in the area of assessment in teaching learning process.



MINUTES OF STAFF COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 03rd October, 2019.




- The teachers of D. M. School will be involved in the Chilika Block Research studies.



MINUTES OF STAFF COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 05th December, 2019.




MINUTES OF STAFF COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 06th February, 2020.

A Staff Council Meeting was held on 06th February, 2020, under the chairmanship of Principal Prof. P. C. Agarwal in the staff common room in the presence of twenty faculty members.

The Principal apprised the staff members and discussed about the following points.

- SCC Meeting for Odisha state was organized on 4th February, 2020. The SCC meetings for all the states are over except West Bengal. Principal requested the department to formulate the proposals and submit them for SCB meeting.
- Principal praised the Coordinators of Multicultural Placement Programme and Working with Community for successful completion of the Programmes. He also said that such programmes are appreciated by the students too.
- International conference "Education in 21st Century" will be held from 21st to 23rd February, 2020. Prof. Vasudha Kamath, Former V.C. The meeting ended with a Vote of Thanks by Dr. Kumar Parag.
















At the outset, Prof. S.K. Dash, Secretary of the Staff Council requested to Prof. P.C. Agarwal, Principal to Chair the meeting for discussion on various issues of the Institute.

Prof. Agarwal welcomed all staff members present in the meeting and discussed on the following agenda items:

1. Curtailment of Summer Vacation as per Govt. of Odisha Guidelines.
2. To increase intake capacity of the students as per discussion made with Director, NCERT.
3. Schedule of Odd-Semester Examination
4. Approval of PAC Programmes
5. Regarding conduct of CEE-2022
6. Extension of engagement of Assistant Professors on Contractual Basis for the Session-21-22

- (1) Discussion was made regarding Summer Vacation to be commenced from 1st to 16th June-2022 as per Govt. of Odisha guidelines. In connection with curtailment of summer vacation, Prof. S.R. Sahoo, Dean (I) referred to the orders of Higher Education Department, Govt. of Odisha. Prof. B.N. Panda also commented that we may also follow the same order of Govt. of Odisha since, the affiliating Utkal University is under Govt. of Odisha. In this connection, Prof. Agarwal opined that a meeting may be conducted with CRs of different programmes through Dean (I) regarding curtailment of summer vacation and to complete all the academic activities in time, since the academic calendar of Utkal University is different in comparison to this Institute. The suggestion of the Principal was unanimously accepted by all members of the Staff Council.

- (2) Prof. Agarwal informed the House that the Director, NCERT is suggesting to increase the intake capacity of students in all RIEs. Some RIEs has consented to increase the intake capacity of about 50 to 100 students. All the members of the Staff Council expressed their views that RIE, Bhubaneswar don't have adequate Class Rooms and Hostels & the New Hostel is under construction which will be completed in next year, then only better accommodation will be provided to the existing students. It has also discussed that a proposal has already been sketched for construction of a New Boys Hostel in this Institute. Thereafter, it has been unanimously decided that a committee will be constituted under the Chairpersonship of Dean (I), Dean (R), all HODs and senior faculties of DESSH as members to submit a proposal to the Council for increasing the intake capacity of students from 55 to 100 in B.A. B.Ed. programme.
- (3) In connection with the Odd-Semester Examination-2021-22, Prof. L.D. Behera, I/c. Academic Section informed that the Examination will be started from 22nd April-2022 from 08:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and will be completed on 07th May-2022.
- (4) Prof. Agarwal informed the House about approval of some PAC Programmes under Research/Development/Extension. It has also been suggested that respective programme coordinators need to initiate the programmes as soon as possible.
- (5) Further, Prof. Agarwal informed that Council has recommended to conduct the CEE for this year by the RIE, Bhopal. The examination of CEE has been scheduled to be held on 24th July-2022 through offline mode.
- (6) Discussion was made regarding extension of engagement of Assistant Professors on Contractual Basis engaged during the current Session. All Heads of Departments also agreed to extend the engagement of Contractual faculty members initially up to 30th June-2022 as per academic need of this Session. Prof. P.C. Agarwal requested to all HODs to submit their requirement accordingly.

All members of the Staff Council were requested to discuss about any other issues in the meeting.

Dr. Kalinga Ketaki enquired about the method of conducting the CEE for the Session 2022-23. Accordingly, Prof. Agarwal suggested that the mechanism will be finalized latter on in consultation with the Nodal Officers of all RIEs.

Prof. L. D. Behera suggested to continue the Classes of 7th Semester during gap period of the Semester Examination. It was decided that 03 Classrooms may be identified by Academic Section to continue the Classes during the gap period of Examination and the same classrooms should not be allotted for conduct of examination.

As per request of Prof. S.K. Dash, Secretary of Staff Council, Prof. Saurabh Kapoor, Joint Secretary offered vote of thanks to all members of Staff Council and the meeting was ended.

MINUTES OF STAFF COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 6TH OCTOBER 2022

- The staff council meeting was held on 6th October, 2022 in the staff common room of the Institute under the chairmanship of Esteemed Principal Prof P.C. Agarwal.
- Staff Council Secretary Prof S. K. Dash, welcomed all the members and invited the Principal to chair the meeting.
- Principal Prof P.C. Agarwal extended his warm welcome to all the learned faculty members present in the house.
 - He informed about the completion of admission of B. Sc. B.Ed., B. A. B. Ed. programmes.
 - Furthermore, he informed the house about the Admission programmes of B. Ed. and M. Ed. which is scheduled to be held during 10th - 12th October, 2022.
 - He requested all the Head of the Departments to ensure that all the classes are to be engaged as per the time table.
 - He informed that KALA UTSAV is to be held during 3rd to 7th January, 2023 in which he requested the faculties to make it successful with full co-operation.
 - He emphasized that Staff council meeting will be held regularly.
 - He emphasized that Internship supervision in B. Sc. B. Ed, B. A. B. Ed. and M. Ed. programmes need to be done systematically for which the list of faculty members as observers need to be prepared in advance in consultation with overall coordinator Prof. Sandhya Rani Sahoo.
- Prof P. C. Agarwal mentioned that for preparation of NAAC Report, lots of internal paper work is to be done soon, then only it could be uploaded in the NAAC website in time. In view of this, each NAAC committee need to be seen in details about the documentation of the respective sections, otherwise it would not be possible to upload the documents in the website. He also made it clear that Integrated Teacher Education programmes such as, B.Sc. B. Ed., B. Ed., and M. Ed. will not be taken up by the institute from the next academic session if NAAC accreditation is not there.
- For newly admitted students Principal Prof P.C. Agarwal informed that Anti-ragging committee should visit all the hostels in regular interval of time for ensuring that ragging is discouraged in the institute.
- Principal suggested that Internship supervision must be performed atleast twice in each school by engaging the regular as well as contractual faculties as per the schedule.
- Prof S. K. Dash opined that after the admission process of B. Ed. and M. Ed. programmes is over, nomination of student representatives will be done for student council.
- Principal, Prof P. C. Agarwal spoke about mid PAC meeting for which all the programme coordinators have to submit a brief write up (activity wise) about the progress of their programmes along with budget allocation and budget utilization.

- Prof R. K. Mohalik mentioned about the "Cyber Jaagrookta Diwas" programme in which proper scheduling need to be done every month according to the letter of CIET, New Delhi. Principal Prof P. C. Agarwal suggested to initiate such programmes by Prof R. K. Mohalik on behalf of ICT studio/CAC under extension and expression series.
- Prof R. K. Mohalik enquired about the best practices for NAAC. In response to this Principal Prof P. C. Agarwal, told that field exposure programmes may come under such best practices for the NAAC report. He also highlighted that such best practices could be seen from the NAAC reports of other institutions who have already achieved A+ in NAAC. Prof B. N. Panda responded that for developing NAAC report, the institute can hire experts for documentation writing. Meanwhile Principal Prof P. C. Agarwal said that, first of all we should prepare the outline of the documentation then only we can invite the outside experts for support. Prof B. N. Panda also said that we can have an interaction meeting with Prof G. Viswanathappa about the preparation of NAAC report. However, Principal Prof P. C. Agarwal categorically mentioned that we have to collect 4-5 NAAC Report of A+ grade NAAC accredited institutions for examining the exact documentations to be incorporated for development of the report.
- The meeting was ended with "The vote of thanks" as proposed by the Staff council secretary Prof S. K. Dash, Head DESM.

- The Staff Council meeting was initiated by Prof. S. K. Dash, Staff council Secretary by requesting Prof. P. C. Agarwal to chair.
- Prof. P. C. Agarwal welcomed all the members present in the Staff Council and expressed his thankfulness for smooth conduct of the internship programme of B.Sc. B.Ed., B.A. B.Ed. and B.Ed. Students of the Institute in different JNVs.
- He also mentioned that 3 tenders such as -
 - Food Tender
 - Bedding Tender
 - Transportation Tender has already been floated, which will be opened on 14th December 2022.
- Furthermore, he informed that Math Conference will be held in the Institute from 21st to 22nd December 2022 and process is going on to invite the Chief Guest and Chief Speaker, to maintain the quality of the conference.
- He also mentioned that Mr. Dharmendra Pradhan, Honorable Education minister suggested to organise one day consultation meet involving students from IIT, NISER on 10th and 11th December 2022 in RIE Bhubaneswar
